

CODE OF ETHICS

The Institute is managed by Army Welfare Education Society. Hence, there is immense emphasis on code of ethics. All faculty should conduct themselves in accordance to the values and ethics of the profession. Their aim is quality and excellence to work, setting an example for the student community to imbibe. Teaching should be influential rather than instructional. Faculty are to instil a sense of patriotism, respect for law and order, feeling of brotherhood and tolerance for all religions, in addition to spirit of co-operation and social service. Faculty should be impartial in relationship and be empathetic to slow learners. Their aim is to improve mental and moral wellbeing of students and ensure that they do not take part in politics. They should promote freedom of thought and expression, coupled with discipline and dignity. The faculty should be well balanced and should refrain from activities which are against ethics, in the presence of students. The faculty should have impeccable moral character and there should be in control of themselves at all times. Care of property is to be accorded top priority. Faculty should promote dignity and solidarity and be polite and courteous towards parents and guardians. They must not divulge confidential matters. They are not to indulge or encourage in any form of malpractice. They must not engage in commercial activities nor sell or canvas or trade. They are not to accept favours and should not be negligent in discharging their duties. They must adhere to the constitutional norms in terms of religious thought. They must ensure communal harmony and refrain from seeking propaganda. They must avoid monetary transactions with students. They must not indulge in immoral activities and these rules are percolated to each and every member of the organization. It would suffice to say that the institute adheres to high standards of code of ethics, driven by values, trust, honesty, integrity, kindness, compassion and empathy.
